

**Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor of Practice
Masters of Engineering Management Program
College of Engineering
University of Nebraska – Lincoln**

The College of Engineering at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln (UNL) seeks to hire a Professor of Practice at the rank of Assistant, Associate or Full to oversee its Master of Engineering Management (MEM) program. The UNL College of Engineering is undergoing an exciting period of significant growth, related in part to the university joining the Big Ten Conference in 2011. The College currently has a top ranked online Masters of Engineering Management Program, and is seeking a leader to grow the program further. The College is co-located in two cities about one hour apart in the state of Nebraska, with approximately 2/3 of the faculty in Lincoln and 1/3 in Omaha.

Based at the Scott Campus in Omaha, this faculty member will be housed in an academic unit relevant to their background and report jointly to that unit chair and the Associate Dean for Graduate Programs in the College of Engineering. This position will be responsible for curriculum development, course delivery, oversight, administration and leadership of the Masters of Engineering Management program.

Responsibilities will include 80% teaching and 20% service. The successful candidate will be expected to be significantly involved in the College's teaching mission and teach a variety of courses at the graduate level in an online format, on topics such as engineering management, technical project management, and leadership. This appointment is intended for an individual who is dedicated to being a leader in educational innovation, curriculum development, and pedagogy. Additionally, the successful candidate will be expected to participate in a variety of non-class activities which address the teaching mission such as advising, mentoring and outreach. Other duties will include ensuring close involvement with faculty in other departments who may teach courses in the engineering management program, fostering interdisciplinary ties with appropriate departments and programs within the University. Networking with industry is also an expected priority.

Applicants are expected to have at least one degree in an engineering field, and a graduate degree in Engineering Management, Industrial Engineering, Business Management or a related field (PhD preferred). Applicants must have previous successful teaching and/or mentoring experiences in Engineering Management, either through formal classroom settings or in professional industry settings (through internal company training courses, professional short courses, etc.), and demonstrate potential and interest in pursuing excellence in teaching/mentoring of engineering students. Applicants are also expected to be eligible or have achieved professional licensure (e.g. PE), and/or have attained typically 5-8 years of post-graduate experience in their technical area of expertise.
